You provide important goods and services. To protect your employees and customers, you should:

- Keep sick employees at home
- Implement social distancing for employees and customers
- Regularly clean high-touch surfaces

You are required to:

- Limit patrons to no more than 10 on site at any given time
- Social distance patrons and separate groups of patrons by at least 6 feet*
- Follow CDC guidelines for cleaning your facility and sanitizing equipment
- Enforce proper handwashing for employees

You should also consider:

- Encouraging delivery, takeout, drive-thru, curbside and off-site services
- Providing special access periods for populations vulnerable to COVID-19
- Adapting staff/customer contacts to avoid close contact.
- Screening the health of employees

DEFINITIONS UNDER THE ORDINANCE:

Social distancing means separation of at least six feet between individuals.

Retail business that promotes public gathering means any enclosed facility operating as a bar, restaurant, brewery, café, casino, coffee shop, recreational or athletic facility, health club, or entertainment venue.

Premise includes any parking lot and/or patio or other outdoor seating area for such facility.

Patron is a customer of the business and does not include employees or staff of such business.

While this new ordinance does not apply to homes, apartments, office buildings, manufacturers, warehouses, consumer services and other sectors of the economy, employers are strongly encouraged to:

- Have sick employees stay home and call their doctor
- Social distance its employees and customers
- Limit public access to buildings
- Regularly clean high-touch surfaces
- Allow employees to work from home, if possible
- Limit unnecessary work gatherings
- Eliminate non-essential travel
- Consider regular health checks and screenings of employees

THE CITY COUNCIL ADOPTED THIS ORDINANCE ON MARCH 26, 2020. IT IS IN EFFECT UNTIL APRIL 8, 2020, UNLESS EXTENDED BY THE COUNCIL WITH FURTHER ACTION.

* Current CDC guideline is social distance of 6 feet to avoid close contact
