

Night watch flood service rate

The night watch flood service rate for electrical service shall be as follows.

This rate applies to any customer for illumination of private property.

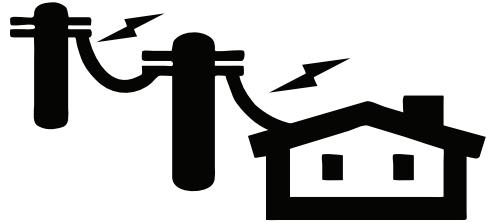
Rate:

<i>Lamp Size in Watts</i>	<i>Monthly Charge</i>
	High-Pressure Sodium
100	\$ 8.24
250	\$ 14.42
400	\$ 24.72

The monthly charges are based on mounting the high-pressure sodium light on a suitable existing pole and the furnishing of up to 100 feet of service wire. Where a new pole must be installed, the customer shall make arrangements with the utilities department for payment of the additional facilities and labor costs incurred in the installation.

New Rates for Customers of Electrical Service

Provided by the
City of Sioux Falls

Effective on all bills mailed
after February 1, 2013



Residential service rate

This rate applies to single-phase service for all domestic uses through one meter. Water heating installations and space heating installations are to be included under this classification.

Customer charge: \$5.67/month

Energy charge: (All kWh) 9.99¢/kWh

Small commercial service rate

This rate applies to all commercial or industrial customers for single- or three-phase lighting, heating, cooking, refrigeration, power to motors, and other approved uses, where the monthly metered energy does not exceed 6,000 kWh.

Customer charge: \$8.50 per month

Energy charge: (All kWh) 11.54¢/kWh

Large commercial service rate

This rate applies to commercial or industrial customers for single- or three-phase lighting, heating, cooking, refrigeration, power to motors, and other approved uses, where the monthly peak demand exceeds 25 kW, or where monthly metered energy exceeds 6,000 kWh.

Customer charge: \$12.87 per month

Energy charge: (all kWh) 3.30¢ per kWh

Demand charge: (all kW) \$15.55 per kW

Meter demand: The metered demand shall be the maximum kilowatt demand established by the consumer for any period of 15 consecutive minutes during the month as indicated or recorded by a demand meter.

Billing demand: The demand to be billed shall be the adjusted demand for the month but not less than 50 percent of the highest demand billing dollars during the preceding 11 months.
